Many of you have received personal thank you letters from Margaret over the years, adopted her beloved foster dogs and communicated with her to organize various fundraisers, holiday parties and all things PACA. Disbelief, anger, sadness, and shock struck on November 1, 2018 as Margaret Bobb passed from this life to the next while surrounded by her loving family.

Margaret joined PACA in 1996, but rescued her first dog, and her 13 puppies, in 1977. She remained a vital part of our rescue organization until her death. She was a rescuer, foster parent, adoption clinic coordinator, treasurer, fundraiser, and board member. She coordinated almost all our administrative functions, and spearheaded PACA's free spay/neuter program "Fix the 505." During her early years of rescue, she realized the need for spay/neuter and did "hard-core" rescuing such as trapping stray dogs and cats, rescuing from death-row at shelters, and working in the "rougher" parts of town doing rescue, education, and offering to spay/neuter/vaccinate people's animals at her own cost. She was a constant voice for those neglected animals that had no voice.

Attempting to sum up a person like Margaret in an article is impossible. Margaret changed the trajectory of hundreds of abandoned, abused or neglected animals' lives. She not only saved animals lives, but added something special, personal, and important to the adopting families' lives.

If you have adopted a dog or cat, donated or volunteered for PACA you also have given to this worthy cause Margaret dedicated her life to. Margaret helped hundreds of special creatures during her time on this earth and they, as well as their adopting humans will be forever grateful. Margaret never turned a blind eye to an animal in need.

We are filled with gratitude to receive the continued support of Margret's family in our mission. We will work closely with them in the years to come, especially for a cause very near to Margaret's heart, PACA's "Fix the 505" FREE Spay/ Neuter program. Her "dream for New Mexico is to have some way to offer spay/neuter to any resident for any pet at any time for FREE. "

Below are some quotes from PACA volunteers and Board Members remembering Margaret and the impact she had on their lives.

"I've been photographing dogs for PACA since 2012 (6 years) with the help of my kids, and our family has fostered several PACA dogs off and on over the years. I went to her house once to photograph a litter of heeler puppies that she had taken in - and my family ended up fostering several of them over the holiday season that year. She was always so happy to hear about how PACA dogs were doing over time after they went to their forever homes. She was always willing to help get dogs spayed/neutered - I connected her with several families who needed help with that. I really miss Margaret! "

Big Hunk O' Love

PACA was contacted by a person saying she had a dog that needed to be euthanized. PACA volunteers Margaret, Daniella and Kim went to the Meadow Lake area of Los Lunas to check on this dog, with food and treats in tow. Upon seeing the dog, there was horror and shock at the dog's condition. He was covered in ticks, had multiple open, infected wounds where his skin was literally falling off, and obvious eye infections. A family member

told us that Hunk was regularly beaten by this "person." This dog, whom was later named Big Hunk, didn't seem ready to give up and our volunteers felt there was hope for him. Big Hunk was very shy and would not approach the volunteers, so they set up a crate and began offering him food. Daniella, a young dog whisperer, was able to get the closest to Big Hunk and offered him a can of food. The next can of food was positioned next to the crate door. When he approached the crate a push got him inside. Big Hunk was petrified. He had never been in a kennel, on a leash, or in a car before. PACA immediately took him to he emergency vet.

Upon examination, it was determined Big Hunk had solar dermatitis, which is a severe infected sunburn caused by exposure to the sun, with no shelter, for years. He was also emaciated and needed treatment for his eyes. He was well behaved, but so petrified he would not walk on leash, so the staff had to carry him everywhere. After two days in intensive care, and a very large vet bill, Big Hunk was ready to go to his new foster home.

Big Hunk's lucky day was June 2nd, when Morgan, his now-foster-mom saw PACA's Facebook plea for a foster home for Big Hunk. She picked up Hunk from the vet and introduced him to her other two dogs and husband. Big Hunk now loves his foster family. Morgan nursed him back to health and set up a shade umbrella so he can

enjoy a nice day outside safely. Hunk's skin is healed except one small spot. He is enjoying the life every dog deserves with walks, playing with his doggie friends. Although physically Big Hunk is almost recovered, mental scars take longer to dissipate. Initially he was hand-shy and nervous whenever anyone picked up a long handled tool. He is now comfortable with his foster mom and dad carrying around tools like rakes or brooms, but still a bit untrusting of strangers doing so. He is a little unsure of strangers at adoption events, especially when reaching for him. However, he has made great strides in becoming a normal dog. It will take time and patience for Big Hunk to fully recover, but he will.

He enjoys other dogs, but would be happy as an only dog too. He is around 5-6 years of age. Years Long Chow Chows Rescue

Sometimes it takes years to help dogs in need. This is but one example. In June of 2015, we received a call for assistance with re-homing some Chow Chows. The owner of the Chows was a breeder of many years, but had fallen ill both physically and mentally, and could not take care of her dogs. She lived in a small town just outside of Belen, which attracts disreputable breeders because of insufficient animal welfare laws. PACA was under the impression that there were only a few Chows that needed rehoming. Upon visiting the property, PACA found eleven dogs in horrible condition, severely matted, and under-socialized. PACA helped to spay/ neuter several Chows through our Fix the 505 program. A few of them were placed into homes. The owner's health improved and there was no further communication until we received another call saying she wanted to move out of state. Homes were found for a few more dogs. A Chow Chow rescue group in California agreed to take the remainder of the dogs. Before the dogs could be transported to California, the owner moved, leaving the dogs to fend for themselves. The dogs remaining on the property were extremely fearful and would not let anyone touch them. Dog trainer Lisa Berry was able to catch the dogs and kept them at her house until the transport. But this is not the end of the story. A couple years later we received a call from a woman whose brother had passed away. The brother had three Chows he was holding on to for the breeder. The sister kept one of the remaining Chows, and the Chow rescue in California agreed to take the remaining two. The Chows' rescue effort took almost two years, from June 2015 to May 2017. The picture is two of the freshly groomed Chows that were adopted by a lovely couple. They stopped by our adoption event to thank PACA for saving the dogs that bring them such joy.

A little more than a year and a half ago, Sable passed suddenly from rapid-onset kidney failure. Roughly two weeks ago Brain began a rapid decline in her health and went from a cat showing her age to unable to walk in a span of 3 days. A visit to the vet showed her kidneys had gone into complete shutdown and there was nothing more we could do. Brain and I would spend her last 48 hours together for every moment, with her eating tuna and sleeping on the deck or a lap, me sleeping on the floor near her.

ASH



She is very affectionate, and LOVES people--she is extremely social with people & very good with kids. She is basically a couch potato but can be energetic. She is a volunteer favorite at our adoption clinics!! Boots is dog selective so she needs to be an only dog or be slowly integrated into a household with another dog. If you only want one loving dog, please consider Boots

Cats and Dogs can be Wonderful Companions

Often potential adopters come to our adoption clinic at PetSmart (8070 Academy Rd NE) or Kitty City at Clark's Pet Emporium on 11200 Menual Blvd. NE, who believe they can't adopt a cat or kitten because they have a dog. In fact, about 60% of our cat adoptions go to homes with a dog. If you are thinking of adding a cat to your dog home or vice versa, it is important to consider both animals' personalities for compatibility. Dogs with high prey drive that like chasing, pinning, or picking up cats are not a good match. Conversely, some cats may not like dogs and prefer a cat only home. PACA does not adopt cats to a home with a doggie door for safety reasons. Kittens or cats will need separation from a dog during an adjustment period. Here are some steps to follow for a slow and successful introduction.

- Put the cat or kitten in a separate room with a litter box, food, and water.
- Let the dog and cat smell each other from beneath a closed door.
- Allow the new cat and dog to rotate their freedom throughout the home to investigate each other's scent.
- Put cat or kitten in a carrier and place it in a central room. Have the dog on leash and allow the dog to smell and observe the cat.
- Once the dog is calm and the cat is eating and using litter box regularly, allow both animals to be in the same room with dog on a leash. Use toys or treats as rewards for good behavior.
- If there is fear or aggression displayed on either animal's part, the dog and cat may be incompatible. Safety is always top priority.
- Find a place for cat food and litter that the dog cannot access.
- Separate both animals when out of the house until they coexist peacefully.

Jen and Craig's home adopted two kittens from PACA. After following our instructions for a slow introduction to their dog Bailey, Jen commented,



"We are so in love with our new kittens and they have settled in great to their new home. They rub against Bailey and purr. I really think they all love each other. We couldn't be happier with these two new additions to our family." Ella, another cat adopted into a home with dogs, adapted to her new dog family quickly. Perhaps, Ella was a puppy at heart.

PEOPLE'S ANTI-CRUELTY ASSOCIATION/ ALBUQUERQUE ANIMAL RESCUE (PACA/

AAR), a No-Kill rescue group, was founded in 1973. Our main mission is to rescue, rehabilitate and rehouse homeless dogs and cats. PACA has no shelter facility and relies on an organized network of foster parents who graciously take animals into their homes and hearts until permanent homes are found.

RESCUE: No-Kill means that healthy, adoptable animals are not destroyed because they are homeless or to make room for another animal. The Care-For-Life concept allows PACA to offer an alternative program for homeless, abandoned, sick, and injured animals. The number of animals we can assist depends on the foster care and financial resources available.

REHABILITATE: PACA devotes resources to correct an animal's health or behavioral problems.

REHOUSE: Care-For-Life rescue requires short and long term temporary housing for animals. This is best met by foster caregivers, not traditional kennel facilities. Foster families are asked to provide transportation to adoption clinics as much as they are able.

SPAY/NEUTER: PACA operates and funds programs to provide spay/neuter in the community, and we trap feral cats for the Trap-Neuter-Return program. We have already had significant success in preventing cat and dog population growth in Albuquerque.
