When Chardonnay showed up to our adoption event with a five-inch wide abscess on her face, PACA took her into the fold. Her owners lost their home and a family member was taking care of Chardonnay. The family member reported her dog had attacked Chardonnay. That is why they were trying to find her a new home. PACA immediately took her to an emergency veterinarian, had the wound cleaned and gave her antibiotics.

Our volunteer Julie stepped up and took Chardonnay as a foster dog to keep her from further harm.

After two weeks, Chardonnay's wound healed, along with her happy-go-lucky spirit. Chardonnay was always a people-loving girl, but understandably leery of other dogs. To prevent overwhelming Chardonnay, she was slowly introduced to the dogs in her foster home. She now enjoys daily life with her new doggie friends; walking, playing, and hunting lizards.

Chardonnay loves to visit the kids at the bus stop. She plays a mean game of fetch, dropping the toy each time to be thrown again. Like any younger dog, she benefits from a walk and playtime daily. She is easy to teach and wants to please. She has received some basic obedience training from her foster mom.

By living in a foster home, PACA volunteers are able to help dogs like Chardonnay recover, recuperate, and overcome behavioral issues. Our foster parents are also able to assess

what type of home and family our rescued dogs would most thrive in. We perform a screening process prior to adoption to make sure the dogs are matched to the perfect, happy family.

You can see Chardonnay at our dog adoption clinics held every Saturday (weather permitting) from 11-2.

They are held outside in the SPROUT's MARKET south parking lot under the trees (Academy & San Mateo). Come see Chardonnay and all of our other adoptable dogs there. Also you can see all of our adoptable dogs at NMPACA.ORG.



Thanks to our dedicated donors, PACA/AAR's free spay/neuter program continues to have an impact. To date we have spayed/neutered 168 dogs/pups and 825 cats/kittens that would have gone unfixed. One of our recipients Josephine (annual household income below \$10,000) tells us "I would not have been able to neuter my pets

About Us

PEOPLE'S ANTI-CRUELTY ASSOCIATION/ ALBUQUERQUE ANIMAL RESCUE (PACA/

AAR), a No-Kill rescue group, was founded in 1973. Our main mission is to rescue, rehabilitate and rehouse homeless dogs and cats. PACA has no shelter facility and relies on an organized network of foster parents who graciously take animals into their homes and hearts until permanent homes are found.

RESCUE: No-Kill means that healthy, adoptable animals are not destroyed because they are homeless or to make room for another animal. The Care-For-Life concept allows PACA to offer an alternative program for homeless, abandoned, sick, and injured animals. The number of animals we can assist depends on the foster care and financial resources available.

REHABILITATE: PACA devotes resources to correct an animal's health or behavioral problems.

REHOUSE: Care-For-Life rescue requires short and long term temporary housing for animals. This is best met by foster caregivers, not traditional kennel facilities. Foster families are asked to provide transportation to adoption clinics as much as they are able.

SPAY/NEUTER: PACA operates and funds programs to provide spay/neuter in the community, and we trap feral cats for the Trap-Neuter-Return program. We have already had significant success in preventing cat and dog population growth in Albuquerque.
