



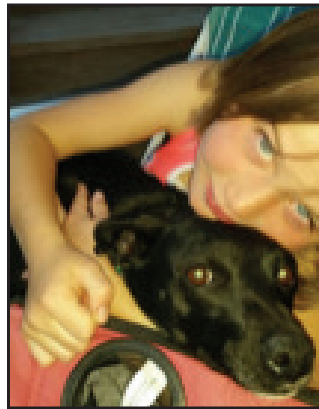
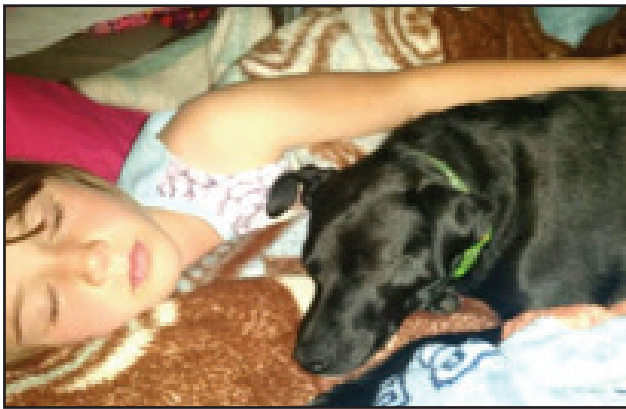

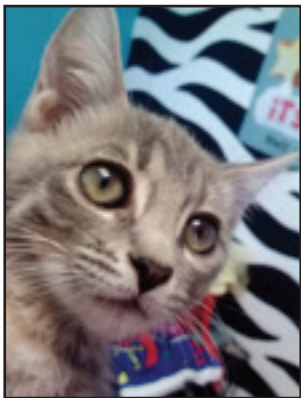
PACA/AAR SUCCESS!

BEST FRIENDS.

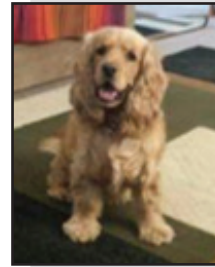

HOME SWEET HOME.

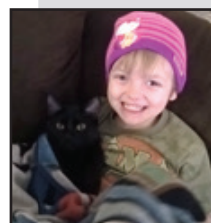

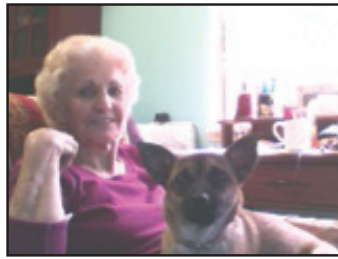
STRAY KITTY WINS LOTTERY.

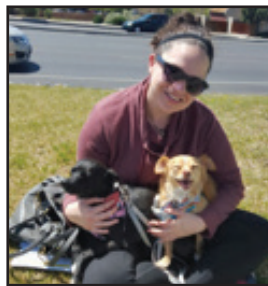
HAPPY TAILS!

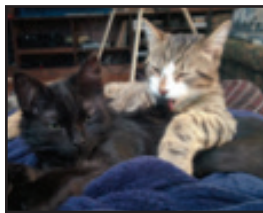
CUDDLE KITTY.

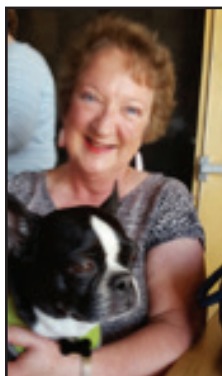
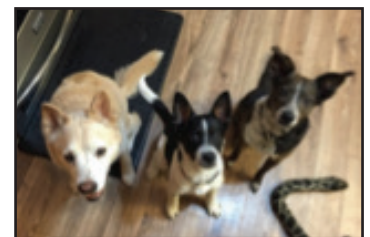


A MELLOW MOOSE.

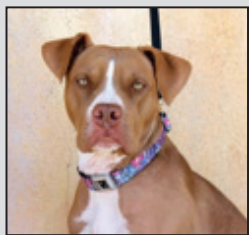
FEATURED CREATURES

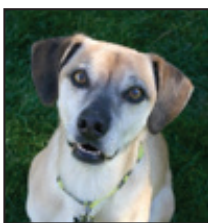


LALA -At 9 years old LALA still has much to offer. She loves laps! She also loves being brushed and is fine with other cats. Her beauty reflects her personality.

ONE-DOG HOMES NEEDED

“Just because we don’t play well with other 4-leggeds doesn’t mean we don’t deserve a happy loving home.” One of the most difficult rescue situations for PACA/AAR is when we rescue a dog that does not care for other dogs. Because nearly all of our foster homes already have at least one dog in them, finding foster care for these “only-dog” rescues is often impossible.

This leaves PACA volunteers in the heart-breaking position of having to put these dogs in boarding until they are adopted. We are actively looking for foster homes (or potential adopters) that do not currently have any dogs to help us foster the dogs that we are forced to keep in boarding. Are you the one-dog home we are looking for?



ANGEL- Facing an uphill battle, this girl was relinquished to us and was emaciated with multiple dog bite injuries, an embedded collar and a tick-borne illness. After a tragic life of dog fights, chaining and breeding, this girl wants nothing more but to enjoy loving human contact, something she never thought was possible.

WENSTON-This 7 year old handsome guy is on the smaller side (about 25-30 lbs) and is housebroken. He is a little shy, and although he lives in a foster home with other dogs, he really wants to be an “only dog.” He would make an excellent companion dog if you are just looking for a nice, quiet little buddy.



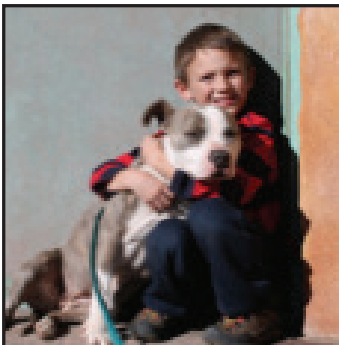

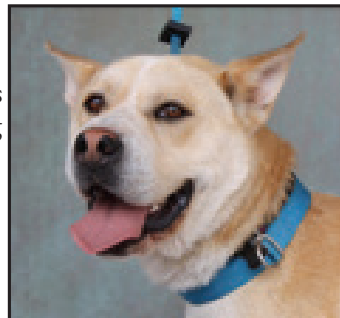

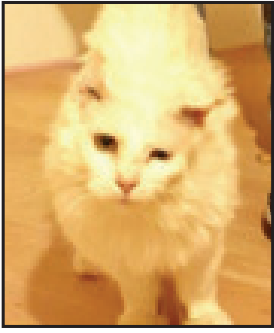

VANILLA: In January, a Good Samaritan employed near Montgomery and Juan Tabo called PACA to report a white cat that had been wandering for weeks behind the building where she works. Attempts by PACA to trap him were initially unsuccessful. Even placing a piece of chicken in the trap didn't work as he figured a way to fish the morsel out without going into the trap. On the third try, a drumstick

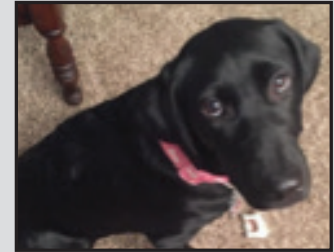
from Church's Fried Chicken was too much for him to resist, and he entered the trap. He looked like he had been on the streets for a while, but he proved to be quite a sweetheart. Upon examination the Vet found that this poor boy was in very bad shape. He was FIV positive, covered with ticks, and had badly matted fur, torn and infected ears, and an abscess on his tail. He received a lot of veterinary treatment, including a course of antibiotics, and amputation of the last half of his tail. The nice lady that spotted him offered to foster him and named him Vanilla. Despite all of his problems, Vanilla turned out to be a rather handsome, if somewhat rough looking fellow.
